



Decoration

The inspiring and utterly improvisational cooking style of Jonah Reider

This year's catalogue encourages us all to let go of big expectations in the kitchen. It's about throwing out the rules and recipes, embracing our imperfections, and getting rid of that voice in our head that tells us we "should" be doing things a certain way. Jonah Reider just happens to be that kind of cook, a kindred spirit who believes, like we do, in bringing fun, ease and confidence back into the kitchen.

onah Reider has been feted as the "dorm-room chef." Known for the inventive and intimate supper club meals that he served out of his Columbia University dorm, the wait list attracted thousands. But it's his relaxed and refreshing approach to cooking that attracts us – and sparks something in us that makes us want to head for the kitchen to just create, no matter what ends up on the plate.

Quite simply, Jonah is our culinary spirit animal, a guy who cooks with perceptible skill yet still embraces those little mistakes and imperfections we all make in the

kitchen. The 21-year-old's style is spontaneous, letting the people he's with, the ingredients he's found, or even the way he's feeling in that moment inspire his creations.

"Most people cook spontaneously, yet they constantly compare their cooking with that of a very formal, fine restaurant," Jonah says. "Thankfully you can make excellent food in this spontaneous, messy, social way."

The dinners he hosted at his dorm-room supper club - up until his graduation in May 2016 – were very much built on this philosophy. >>

"I'm always improvising, like if I run out of a spice, or two more people are coming all of a sudden. I'm open to the possibility of things not going how you expect them to."

It began when he got off the university meal plan and started cooking at home, asking friends to share meals with him. Then word on campus spread, and soon thousands waited patiently to try his low cost, family style meals.

The food Jonah creates is adventurous, confident and charmingly imperfect. You can taste his personality on the plate and the whirling, kinetic energy he pours into each dish. In fact, he never uses recipes, preferring instead to experiment and improvise even if it doesn't work out quite the way he planned – an approach taken in part from his training as a jazz pianist.

"In jazz, everyone is making mistakes all the time, and you just have to embrace the unexpected," Jonah says. "I'm always improvising if I run out of a spice or if two more people are coming all of a sudden. Being open to the possibility of things not going how you expect them to is integral to the process of cooking."

In his mind, it's those unexpected moments that allow great food – and a great time together – to really happen. He tells the story of a meal where he served guests a beautiful roasted duckling, but then realized – he had no idea how to actually carve a duck. Didn't matter. He and his guests had a great time hacking away at the duck and figuring it out.

"If something goes wrong in the kitchen, you can let that fluster you and have it derail what you're making or you can just kind of embrace it and see what happens," Jonah says. "When the reason people are having a meal together is to connect, then mistakes become fun and nourishing."

The intimacy he creates between friends and strangers alike is the part of the meal that interests Jonah the most. What leads to great cooking, in his mind, is having a spirit and energy that invites other people in and curates a great atmosphere.

"I think of what I'm doing as creating a social experience mediated by food, instead of being a chef," Jonah says. "When people come over to eat with me, the point is to not go to a restaurant. It's to share an experience with people. That experience for the diners is the only important thing."

Placing the importance on the social part of dining is also his secret for letting go of those big expectations we tend to put on ourselves, with the prevalence of food television programs and social media images.

"Seeing photographs of beautiful, intricate dishes can make people feel shut out of the kitchen," Jonah says. "But it's just not true that that is the only manifestation of excellent cooking. A large part of good cooking is a good social environment and an excitement about creating food. That is what is most exciting to me – and to a lot of others, once they realize this."

After graduation, he plans to expand his dinner beyond the dorm room to bring his quirky and intimate meals to larger audiences at events around the country.

"People are very excited when they see how low key and extremely fun dining can be," Jonah says. "They realize, wow this is something I can do myself – have friends over and cook incredible food, and turn it into an awesome hangout."■





fear, the more varied their diets will be when they're adults. And variety is something that helps kids' nutrition for the rest of their lives.

"By not engaging kids in the kitchen, you may be setting their eating habits for life" Bryan says. "It sets children up to be more likely to buy prepared foods and eat out more often. You might also create picky eaters as adults, and picky eaters aren't very fun to eat with. Food is such an integral part of our lives for physical and social reasons."

Bryan says he understands the fears parents have, but that with the right support and tools, kids can begin to learn how to prepare food as early as the age of three - when they've absorbed much of the world and start to understand concepts.

"If you learn to cook at an early age, you will continue with it," Lennie says. "It's like riding a bike or learning a language; if you learn it at an older age it takes so much longer and you might lose interest. And the core of cooking - and the kitchen - is the knife. If you have one and know how to use it, you can basically do anything."■





NAME: Anna

WORK: Business Development & Sales LIVES: Copenhagen, Denmark

orn in Hong Kong with most of her childhood spent in New Zealand, Anna has created a new life for herself in Copenhagen, at a co-living space. In the midst of the hip city, 21 entrepreneurial innovators are sharing four apartments. Together they host dinner parties, organize movie screenings, and discuss



everything from life's twists and turns, to business and relationships. It was during a university competition that she first discovered Denmark, and has since travelled back and forth for eight years for what she calls a "recharge". Finally she decided to quit her job as a financial analyst and make the move. Today she works with sales and business development at a start-up that converts clothing sizes for online shops. Although she's travelled a lot, and finds herself more "rooted" nowadays, she describes her dream living situation as being a digital nomad with, not one, but three homes.

What is home for you?

"Home is where the heart is. And for me, it's also family, and now with age, my friends too. For the longest time I would think of New Zealand as my home, but now that my parents live in Hong Kong it's different. Copenhagen is also my home, and I consider these people I share this space with my family, rather than my friends. I've built such close bonds with them, and I know I can rely on them."

What makes a home a home?

"When my inner child can come out." She

bursts out smiling as she reminisces about a childhood memory, something she still does as a young adult. "I think, being comfortable with the people around you, that's what makes a home."

Has technology affected your perception of home?

"Absolutely, I video-chat or call my family once or twice every week. I actually message with my brother every day. That makes me feel like we're not that far apart. For me technology has changed everything. Without it I'm not so sure I'd constantly be moving as I have."

If you could bring five things with you, what would they be?

"The network I've built here, the colour orange, because that's the colour of our coliving space", she laughs, "peoples' drive and the work-life balance. Even though the people living here are all entrepreneurs, they really do have a life. I think that's something the Nordic countries do really well. And lastly, my boyfriend! I'm very detached to physical things. I can't say that my room here reflects my personality. I only really go there to sleep."■



NAME: Mohammed WORK: Artist & Music Producer LIVES: Malmö, Sweden

Mohammed (mostly known as Saint, a childhood nickname) was born and raised in Gambia. He came to Malmö, Sweden as a refugee at the age of 15. He describes his first impressions of Malmö as crazy and very foreign, but with a lot of nice people. Today, he's a student at a music high school, well, not your typical student he'd say, and the leader of a music production workshop for refugee kids. When he isn't in school or at work, he's producing music or cooking (or doing both at the same time). Although neither the refugee accommodation, nor the first tiny apartment in the southern part of Malmö felt anything like home, this one, the apartment he's lived in for the past nine months, is beginning to feel like a piece of his own.

What's home for you?

"That's a really good question. I think I'll always refer to Gambia as home, no matter what. Everything feels pretty temporary now, even though I could see myself

living here for a longer period of time. But n artist and a music producer, you never know. I wouldn't mind moving to another place for a different reason. I've been through so much that I don't mind being disconnected anymore."

What makes a home a home for you?

"Probably the feeling of familiarity. Yeah that's it. To say that music makes my home would be too cliché, but I'll always love music. I mean, I try and incorporate African sounds in my work as much as possible. I know I can recreate the feeling of home anywhere. I'm like a master at that now. When I first moved here, into this apartment, I didn't even buy a mattress. I went to IKEA to buy one and I'm really bad with measurements," he smiles, and tells us about his trip to the big department store, 15 minutes before closing. "So of course we bought the wrong mattress size," he laughs. "So I slept on the couch a lot to begin with, and basically lived in the kitchen. I'd do everything there, chill, eat and record."

Are there things, memories or places that are special to you in relation to vour home?

"Umm," he shakes his head before stating, "not really. Even at 'home home', where I'm from in Gambia. I have these blurry visuals of it. Some of them are strange, some made up, and some fairly vivid. It's not just one specific thing; it's a bunch of things. Like when I hear a song that I might've

heard, or remember hearing as a kid in my Pop's car, or anywhere else. It'll remind me of that moment. That feeling. Then I'll try to recreate that feeling in some way. I'll try and recreate a moment from home."

Has technology affected your perception of home?

"No, technology has nothing to do with home for me. I mean I use it on a daily basis, but it doesn't change how I perceive home, or how I see what home should be. I get in touch with Gambia through social media, but you can't exactly call. Of course I'd feel differently if I didn't have the access, but for me it's more about experiencing a place and people. I value that more. On social media I'm not actually physically there -I'm just talking."

What five things would you bring with you from home?

"I would say, good memories, most definitely. Nobody wants a bad memory from home. And comfort, of course, I'd absolutely have to take my ramen noodles with me," he laughs out, "and my shades!" He pauses while thinking hard on a fifth thing to bring, before saying: "Music. Everywhere I

eet Ineke and her husband, Guido, living with vone is welcome here." their three kids and four cats in Hilversum, a small town outside of artsy Amsterdam. Ineke. born and raised in a small rural area in central Holland, met Guido while working as an interior stylist for a DIY TV show. Today, she has her own business knitting furniture, and sits on a snack-tasting panel three days out of the week. Eating crisps nine o'clock in the morning is one of many things that seem to add to the pure happiness that Ineke radiates. Guido also has his own business, as a carpenter and plumber. By the looks of their space it's obvious he's nothing short of a handyman.

How long have you been living here?

"About 20 years now. When we first got here it was really depressing, dark and smelly," Ineke frowns, "it was what we could afford, and I remember thinking to myself: Oh my gosh, how am I going to make this a nice place? We stripped the whole house. There was even a time when we were sleeping on the floor," she points to the center of their, now quaint, living room, "and you could actually see the sky. The entire neighbourhood was getting new roofs. We'd lay and watch the stars at night", she chuckles.

"We saw potential in being able to create and build a lot of things on our own," Guido says, "I don't want it to be overdressed or perfect. That's why the walls are plastered and not flat." Between the charm of the uneven walls it's obvious that they cherish their space as something selfmade. It's also how their idea of home has come together, reflecting their personalities. "I'm really a bit of a collector. I can't bring myself to throw away old stuff", Ineke smiles.

What do you think of when you hear the word "home"?

"Cozy and warm, Ineke answers confidently, "It's a feeling. It's my family, definitely. Although I work a lot, more than anything else I'm a mother. I really love spending time with my kids. 
rom one home to another, Eric really embodies the essence of a digital nomad. He has spent most of his life moving around, traveling from one place to the other - France to Sweden, to Canada, Norway, and Sri Lanka. With a Swedish mother and a French father he describes his view on home as a way of life. Today he works at a start-up company that aims to make online second hand trading and upcycling fun and easy. It's been eight months since he moved to Copenhagen, but it only took one week for the co-living space to feel like home.

What's home for you?

"It's a sense of calm. Since I've been traveling a lot, home is where I actually relax. That's the first thing that comes to mind. It's of course my room, my desk, my bed, but it's also how I move around in my life - when I go to the store, when I meet my friends in cafés, or when I go to certain bars that I like. It's a way of being. I moved a lot as a kid, so I think I learned a lot about home by experiencing that. In some sense, I think I also like it. I've also made choices that have forced me to change homes a lot as well."

"No, not the basic feeling of it. The feeling of a home has staved the same for me, because I think that home is based on feelings. It has however changed how I live at home, for sure. But then there are certain aspects where I try to keep away from technology, so that I'm able to just have the pure sensation of an experience. An example of this would be cooking. For me it's meditation."



"I have an idea of places that I like, but I guess I'm not the typical Swede in that sense that I know exactly the kind of home I want in the future. And I'm not going to give you a "family"answer. I know I'd want to live in a city, and then have a place that is calm to go to during the weekends. It's more of a dream lifestyle, rather than a home, I guess. It'll still be a feeling for me, maybe a mix between a physical place and my relationships in that place. Now my relationships are spread all out. I'm not sure I will own a home. I know I won't own a car. I'll be carpooling and those kinds of things. I think there might be similar solutions for homes in the future."

What home is for a refugee without one

Outside each plastic-panelled shelter, you see pairs of shoes. Many are muddy and dusty, evidence of the long journey taken to get here. They sit lined up outside door after door, a glimpse of the people within - parents, children, aunts and infants, who fled their homes in fear. Taking off your shoes at the door is a familiar custom, one many of us share. And here in a refugee camp, it demonstrates something powerful - a deep respect for the idea of home, however tenuous or temporary.

or many refugees fleeing the Syrian civil war – a battle that has raged since 2011 - home is a flat-pack shelter. Initially funded by IKEA Foundation, and designed by Swedish social enterprise Better Shelter in cooperation with the UN Refugee Agency (UNHCR), they are one-room units that offer refugees in camps more dignity, safety and privacy than the tents that have been used since World War II. They have four walls, windows. room to stand straight up – and even a lock on the door.

"Moving into a shelter means this might be your home for while, and being able to close a door behind you - and lock it - means so much," says Märta Terne, the Communications Manager at Better Shelter. "It's something that a lot of us take for granted – those private moments and the private space you have for yourself."

"Being able to be alone or with your family inside a controlled space is important, especially for people who have experienced such trauma," she says. "They need to feel safe, be able to close that door, and just relax for a bit."

Since 2015, UNHCR has ordered about 15,000 Better Shelters, which have been and choose to make it cozy." >>

deployed by the refugee agency in seven countries. But two of those countries – Greece and Iraq – particularly illustrate the ways in which Syrians have responded to the crisis, and how these shelters are housing refugees from just a few days up to many years.

"We consider this our house now"

Most Syrians have escaped to neighbouring countries – like Iraq, Lebanon and Jordan – where a shared culture, language and religion make the transition much easier. Thousands end up in refugee camps, like the ones in the relatively quiet northern Iraqi cities of Erbil and Sulaymaniyah, waiting for the war to end. They live in limbo, with little freedom to move around and no access to jobs or education. And while they wait, they do what any of us would – they make their Better Shelters feel more like home.

"The camps in Iraq are a bit more permanent," Märta says. "People have had a chance to bring more personal items, and have spent more time decorating the shelter with textiles to make it more personal. They, in a sense, accept that this will be their home for a period of time,



Better Shelters are designed to house refugees who have fled armed conflict, persecution or natural disaster. They are built with refugees' unique needs in mind. Better Shelters:



- last 3 years, 6 times longer than a typical refugee tent
- are modular and can be adapted, moving the windows and doors wherever needed
- are illuminated by a solar-powered LED light that also charges mobile phones
- can be locked from the inside or out using a padlock
- offers families a living space of 17.5m².



A few hundred kilometres east of the Syrian border, there are thousands of Better Shelters erected in the two camps here. They are far better than fabric tents, especially when Iraqi winters turn cold. The floors are raised to provide insulation, while the hard plastic walls stop wind and provide privacy.

"Of course, we can't compare this housing with our real home back in Syria, but there is a huge difference compared to living in a tent," says Noveldin, a Syrian refugee living in the Kawergosk refugee camp in Erbil, who asked that his last name not be used. "We consider this our house now."

Outside many of these modular shelters which can be assembled in just a few hours - you see people cleaning panels, hanging up laundry or tending to the flowerbeds and small from home.

Safety and security a lock can bring

An estimated 10 per cent of Syrian refugees have chosen a dramatically different path one that has taken them on a perilous and sometimes deadly journey across the Aegean Sea to Europe. Many ended up in temporary accommodation facilities like Kara Tepe on the Greek island of Lesbos, a place where they can feel secure, and get access to services and Three meals a day, hygiene items like soap protection.

"It is a humbling and awe-inspiring experience," says Boris Chesherkov, the UNHCR spokesperson on Lesbos. "It's emotionally taxing for all of us. When you see the level of desperation they felt to take this extremely dangerous journey, you understand that your role has meaning."

Since 2015, more than a million refugees have transited through Lesbos, an island that has shown tremendous goodwill, compassion and generosity. There are just 86,000 residents, who have welcomed refugees like Anouar* with open arms and open hearts.

A 40-year-old former taxi driver from

Aleppo, Syria, Anouar fled the city of his birth – and the family home his father built - with his wife, nephew and five children. A rocket fell just blocks from their house, causing fences they have put up to recreate something part of it to collapse. With Aleppo crumbling around them, they fled through Turkey and "All of these symbolic actions and items onto a smuggler's boat to Greece. They came with nothing but ID cards and some clothes, unable to salvage anything from their house - no photos, no keepsakes, no record of their

> "When there are no loud sounds, no planes, no shooting, I can make my kids go to sleep," says Anouar's wife Amina*. "In Syria when the planes came, the kids woke up and cried and screamed. This was from the war. My kids can sleep here and relax more."

> Refugees are called guests in these camps, a show of respect and support from the local Greek authorities, UNHCR and other organizations that facilitate a range of services. and baby diapers, and a place to charge their





mobile phones are all provided. But the Better Shelter is where they spend most of their time.

"Locking the door is excellent," Amina says, "This is something that makes us feel safe and secure. My kids will not just walk out or something. We care about the personal belongings we have and now we keep them without worry."

Even though they stay just a short time, they make an effort to carve out personal space for their family – likely the first safe space since their escape.

"They stay for a short time, but they instantly start making it their own home," Märta says. "They wash their clothes and hang them up outside or inside the shelter. They create a cozy corner with blankets. And you can see shoes outside every shelter because they want to keep it clean. Finding a home and a safe space, even though it's temporary, is very important."

This notion of what "home" is for a refugee and how it could be made better was a particularly powerful idea for IKEA Foundation, whose mission is to create better opportunities for children.

"There are currently about 60 million forcibly displaced people in the world, and of that about 50-60 per cent are children," says Jonathan Spampinato, communications manager for IKEA Foundation. "That's Canada. Imagine a country the size of Canada filled with children without a safe place to call home, living in a camp somewhere. It's probably the single greatest need that children have – a place to sleep and a place to live."







Our passion is to make things better. However, we don't just innovate for the sake of innovation. We innovate towards a brighter future. Which sometimes also results in asking unusual questions. Like, could we make furniture out of the same material used to make an egg carton? Or, can recycled, low cost paper pulp have a role beyond product packaging? Actually, that's exactly what we asked ourselves, and so the exploration of paper-made furniture began. Yes really, paper.

Furniture made out of paper. Really?


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R rom one country to the next, an IKEA design team travelled around the world to visit factories and suppliers for fresh inspiration and knowledge. The road from idea to prototype is not always a straightforward one – the entire paper industry is built upon deeply rooted traditions. "They think you're a little crazy – what you might think is beautiful, somebody else will

say is impossible. It's really important to stay curious," Designer, Hanna Dalrot smiles. The team describes it as a highly collaborative process: "One thing is for sure: they understand the value of paper and its ability to be renewed. They know that there's a worth to the things that people dispose of.", Michael Nikolic, Creative Leader explains. >>

Staying environmentally conscious was the focal point for the design team. "The paper industry takes care of a lot of waste. So we thought, instead of producing packaging, which is eventually thrown away, recycled or re-produced into a new package, why not create something aesthetic out of this? That's when IKEA is at its best – when we do things differently" Nikolic continues. Today, nine different materials have been chosen; paper being the base of it all. "It's a wonderful material and there are multiple ways to apply it, but even so, it's also quite complex."

Paper pulp, one of the team's main discoveries, is basically recyclable paper turned into a pulp and placed into a mould. Once moulded, it becomes a hard shell based on the choice of thickness and design. This process works similarly to the way other tradi-

tional materials are cast or moulded, such as ceramic, plastic or metal. But it's paper. The lengths of its fibres, together with the amount of glue, determine the hardness and quality of the final product. Other additives can create additional attributes, like making it water-repellant or giving it a colour. In the end, the team strived to develop structural and stylish products that can also be decomposed. Designer Maja Ganszyniec refers to her father, who recently threw away his old sofa: "It took him almost two days to sort the materials for recycling. Who has two days to dismantle a sofa? No one. So most of us will just chuck the whole thing away, and that's not good for the environment. That's why it's important for us to design these products in a way that's easy for you to take them apart and separate the materials once the lifetime of the product

"We work towards making something better in the future. For me it's about impacting people's lives for the better, and hopefully solving new problems along the way. Although we aren't there yet, the best is yet to come."








Paper pulp, paper clay, paper glue, paper cotton and washable paper - the possibilities feel endless! These applications of paper are consistently being tested and developed into something we'd normally expect to be turned into a magazine, a milk carton, or yet another package. With a ton of ideas, tests and discoveries yet to be made, one big question still remains: will there be IKEA furniture made out of paper? The answer: the best is yet to come. No one knows quite yet how it will end. "Since it's such a new way of working with this material, and has never been done at this scale of production before, it's a very daring project. It depends on so many different details - the composition of the material, the thickness, and the construction of the shell. We have to regulate three or four aspects at the same time. So of course it's a journey." Maja says. So at IKEA, staying relentlessly curious can in fact be a good thing. If we stop questioning our approach or products, we only keep creating what's already been done. We always want to aim for something original, something conscious, something bold - something better for you like furniture, made out of paper.

"The Punja loom has to change," he recalls thinking. But it was easier said than done. There is no large-scale, professional industry for manufacturing handlooms, he explained. This experience, combined with a serioften pieced together as makeshift framing



Machine manufacturers weren't interested in the project. So, to create a model himself, Pankaj traveled on bumpy, washed-out rural roads for hours visiting automobile repair shops for spare parts with the supplier's civil and electrical engineers, often having to overcome language issues with different Indian dialects. On one visit, the local auto mechanic near the factory was unable to finish a task on time because he had no power for days.

"At every moment, I was on the verge of breaking down and thinking this wasn't going to happen because of time constraints and resource scarcity," he said. "But my manager told me, 'Keep trying. I believe in you and your logic."

After many months, Pankaj, with support from fellow co-workers including manufacturing specialist Deep Saluja and quality developer Sabarinath P, created four small-scale models. One of these was fabricated and made into three prototype machines that would be tested by weavers for two months. Then his next hurdle: What if the weavers didn't want to work on it?

At first they didn't, he said. They hesitated to try this strange new "machine." But slowly the perception changed.

Weavers were happy to work on it and said they felt less tired at the end of the day. With higher comfort came a feeling of pride and prestige. The redesigned loom also doubled production.


Today, nearly 600 of the new punja looms are being used in India and Bangladesh, enabling the weaving centres to hire more people, including a high percentage of women. By 2017, 3,500 looms will be in operation and the benefits will be felt by many more weavers in more communities. In fact, the impact could get even bigger – IKEA made the decision to not patent protect the loom so it would be available for others in the rug industry to use.

Pankaj feels a big sense of satisfaction that he played a role in preserving and developing the craft of hand-weaving. making a positive impact on people's livelihoods, and creating a sustainable solution for IKEA...

...and that he is finally able to weave on a punja loom.

The IKEA flat pack was introduced back in 1956 when a co-worker designer took the leg off a table to make it fit in his car. That was the beginning of our celebrated and - let's be honest - sometimes complained about flat packs. The revolutionary flat pack became a reflection of our unique way of thinking and doing, driven by a passion to always improve, as well as a whole lot of stubbornness.

Thinking inside the box



Our packaging philosophy relies on – or is wrapped into – a few principles: focus on the customer; packaging as part of the product; optimize cost throughout the value chain: the health and safety of our co-workers and customers; positioning the IKEA brand; and having a positive impact on people and the planet.

But how does it happen? You would be forgiven for thinking that we simply squeeze products into the smallest and flattest package possible. Not quite. The best packaging solutions are integrated into the product development process, resulting in flatter packs and even more affordable prices. Maximal usage and minimal waste is always what we're striving for – in the actual packaging, but also in the loading of each pallet, each container and each shipment. It's all one gigantic puzzle that needs

Over the years we've come up with some revolutionary solutions, but there's also been setbacks and failures. "Only the one who sleeps makes no mistakes," says the founder of IKEA, Ingvar Kamprad. GLIMMA is a shining example of great packaging. These small and popular tealights were previously sold as 100 loose canaged – and this will only increase. dles packed in a plastic bag.

Since then, we have improved the packaging step by step, saving space on our pallets and hence becoming more sustainable, and at the same time protecting the candles to ensure they reach our stores in good shape. The new and improved packaging saves 30-45 minutes per day in store of packaging materials and maximize the handling, we can fit 108 more packages on each pallet and – listen to this – because of the large volumes we move of this product, approximately 400 fewer trucks will impact on people and the planet, which hit the roads with GLIMMA.

JOKKMOKK is another example of good packaging - but maybe a little too good. It seems that some people had a hard time grasping the fact that we squeezed one table and four chairs into the same flat to fit together. What we at IKEA dislike pack. This great packaging solution became

But with EKTORP, we got it right. EKTORP was the first sofa that came knocked-down and flat-packed, which has been a huge improvement for customers because it means they can bring it home by themselves. And as a result, the majority of sofas and armchairs today are flat pack-

And that's not all. We have stopped using expanded polystyrene in our flat packaging and replaced it with paper-based materials. We also recycle the stretch film used around our pallets, using it as a raw material for some of our products.

We constantly work to minimize the use efficiency of our transportation – so we ship as little empty air as possible. The reason for all of this? We want to have a positive includes taking a lead in turning packaging waste into resources, and maximizing the use of renewable and recycled packaging materials. That's at the heart of every IKEA packaging solution. ■

Unlocking opportunities for kids through play

The genuine glee on a kid's face when they play with a great toy – one that captures the imagination and sparks creativity – is universal. Rich or poor, northern hemisphere or southern, a great toy opens up the mind and heart. And it's why play is being used in places like the Comoros islands as a safe and powerful way to teach kids the skills that prepare them for school – and beyond.

he Comoros is an archipelago nation in the Mozambique Channel that few have heard of. The islands are naturally breathtaking, yet it's one of the poorest countries in Africa. Here, toys are resources that simply aren't available for all children as they are in wealthier nations. But with the help of IKEA Foundation and UNICEF, kids here and in emergency settings around the globe are playing their way to becoming capable and confident individuals thanks to Early Childhood Development (ECD) kits.

The size of a large suitcase, the 159
UNICEF ECD kits in the Comoros are colourful and exciting treasure boxes that include
IKEA toys carefully selected by UNICEF to teach vital life skills to kids between the ages of three and six. It's an important age for grandparents might rem puppets that teach kids with peers and express sorters that teach fine-meration; and coloured pays of three and six. It's an important age for

learning the cognitive and social skills that will help them succeed in school.

"Play is the easiest way to stimulate this kind of learning and development," says Julika Riegler, IKEA Foundation's communications liaison with UNICEF. "It's how a human develops. We learn through touching things, interacting with our peers, identifying things with our eyes, recognizing colours and counting."

The IKEA Foundation-donated toys in the kits are timeless, the kind that even our grandparents might remember having. Hand puppets that teach kids how to communicate with peers and express themselves; shape sorters that teach fine-motor skills and cooperation; and coloured paper and scissors that stimulate creativity. >>

The Kit

Project in numbers

The ECD kits are the brainchild of UNICEF, as part of their effort to make early childhood education, stimulation and growth a right for all children. It's a goal that IKEA Foundation shares, which is why they were happy to donate enough IKEA toys to eventually reach more than 1.2 million kids.

The kits are used in conflict areas like Syria and Lebanon, and places like the Comoros that lack the structure and resources to educate kids in ways that encourage emotional learning, creativity, as well as develop their cognitive and motor skills.

"Teachers now have the tools that help them engage nursery school children in a more active way," says Miriam Mareso, the Chief of Education for UNICEF Comoros. "The toys help to enable learning through creativity and the interaction between children. These are important factors that help prepare children for what they will experience in primary school."

Working with the local government in the Comoros, UNICEF introduced the ECD kits along with a training program to guide teachers on how to teach through play – and the results are pretty touching.


"The kids are very happy and they play a lot so everyone is running to be the first to take the kits," says Hadidja Youssoufi Chanfi, a nursery school teacher at Vouvouni Primary School, just outside of the capital of Moroni. "Everyone is saying: 'this is for me' and 'this is for me.' And it makes them very active and more participative."

Parents have also noticed the way this new approach to learning has excited, motivated and energized their children.





Left | Teacher Hadidja Youssoufi Chanfi demonstrates to students how to role-play using IKEA hand









"I've seen a lot of change because he's repeating a lot of things on the blackboard at home that he learns in school," says Hadjira Hamidou, the mother of a fouryear-old boy named Outhaimine at the Vouvouni Primary School. "He is drawing a moon and a sun the way the teacher is showing them. It gives him a good spirit."

UNICEF has already found that the kids who benefit from early childhood development programmes are more successful in school and have a lower dropout rate, a particular problem in poor communities.

"Children identify school with fun and that keeps them in school," Julika says. "This is a way to unlock opportunities for kids to develop into young adults, who have the opportunity to study, start businesses, have an income, and support their own children and families later. That's the long-term growth that education and play can bring."■

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We're for helping kids appreciate how nature nourishes
